
This house is Si SE3 facing, compass reading of 143 degrees, in the time period of 8.

The land has all the necessary forms around to ensure its protection and prosperity: There is a 'Black Turtle' at the back- slightly raised dense trees behind. The 'Green Dragon' and the 'White Tiger' are present on the east and westsides- hedging and shrubbery providing necessary height and enclosure. Finally, there is a "Red Phoenix' in the front of the house- the island/ land mass across a bed of water. This property has the added creek that flows under the house, acting as moving water. All these mystical animals symbolize the balance the land has, providing abundant wealth, stability and harmony for this property.

On site, the property is also well balanced. There are no landforms that have any 'Sha Chi' - negative Chi on this property and house- no T junctions, cul-de-sacs, protruding land masses and sharp corners pointing at the property. The whole property is protected from the city streets so well, that when on site, one is transported into a world of peace, beauty and prosperity.



When realizing the 'good' or 'bad' Feng Shui of a home, one does consider the success of the present owners. The present owners have enjoyed a very successful 4 years on this property, with both parties excelling in their various businesses. They have built and grown this land, filling it with loving Chi. They have now excelled so much in this home, that it is time to relocate to a new home that will support the next phase of their lives.

The primary thing to address here is the moving water that flows under part of the house. This feature is not just an impressive architectural and landscaping design element; it also brings constant Chi toward the house. The concrete modernist architecture provides ample grounding and protection for the base of the house that is above the creek. Unlike a wood frame house, this solid support protects the home from excessive 'water flow' that a wood frame home would not be able to provide. Hence the Feng Shui is enhanced.

It is also valuable to note that the zen garden was built around an existing zen garden that had been cared for, for many years. Zen gardens are traditionally designed with precision to enhance and allow Chi to flow, settle and pool in zones that bring peace and prosperity. The back facing part of the kitchen has Mountain Star 8 and Water Star 6, promising wealth and fame. These extremely fortunate two zones and the gorgeous featured home alone makes this a most auspicious purchase.

The entrance and dining room has Mountain Star 3 and Water Star 1, another combination that promises more wealth and travels. The waterfall outside the entrance door pulls this fortunate Chi into the home, as well as providing soothing water sounds.
